



News from your Parish Council

Parish Council Meeting Update: Please note there is NO Parish Council meeting in January due to the Clerk's holiday. The next meeting has been brought forward by 1 week from 13th to 6th February to accommodate the lengthy time between the Dec. & Feb. meetings. Meetings from March onwards will revert back to the 2nd Thursday of the month, in the PDCC lounge, starting at 7.30pm.

The Lows bench: Someone has cut a small wedge from the seat of the Lows Bench which now requires sanding and sealing as a result. This bench was lovingly made by Ed Cooke for the benefit of the people of Palgrave who use the Lows footpath to Diss, as a place to sit and reflect, enjoy the peaceful views, and possibly catch their breath before moving on. If you see anyone attempting to damage the bench, do please let us know as a matter of urgency. Or if you know who the perpetrator is, please have a quiet word with them. Thank you!

Diss and District Neighbourhood Plan: We need someone more than ever to assist the PC as the threat of more housing grows following statements issued by the Government could make a significant impact to our communities. Meetings are generally held remotely with the odd attendance in person. If you feel you can contribute by attending and reporting back to the PC, please get in touch. We would love to have you on board!

The BT Phone box opposite the Church: BT are disconnecting it in early 2025. Records show it was only used once in the last 12 months. We've agreed to purchase it at the nominal cost of £1. But what do we do with it? Thousands of boxes have been reinvented as cafes, mini-libraries, to name just a few ideas. Could it be a small gallery or a permanent art installation? Funding may be available through the Pride in Your Place initiative to make your vision happen, so please put your thinking caps on, and get back to us with your ideas. Let's make this a unique source of pride for Palgrave!

HOT OFF THE PRESS!! Our 20mph campaign received official approval by Suffolk County Council at meeting level. We applaud Phil and Rupert for their work on this.

Threatening Youths at the PDCC: During the course of our November meeting, we experienced a frightening incident with youths in the PDCC grounds resulting with us calling the Police. The youths dispersed immediately and were nowhere to be seen when the Police arrived, who were extremely helpful. We don't know who the youths were but behaviour like this is never acceptable.

POLICE CONNECT

Keeping you informed, keeping your community safe

Suffolk launches new digital service to support response to incidents.

Suffolk Constabulary is launching a three-month trial using Enhanced Video Response (EVR) across its Response Investigation Teams from 2 January 2025.

This new system will provide victims with the option of speaking with a police officer remotely and promptly via a video link to obtain immediate details of the incident and initial evidence.

This three-month trial is being launched with the aim of expanding video appointment capability outside that which is already offered by the Domestic Abuse Video Response Team (DAVR).

The process will follow a member of the public calling into the Contact and Control Room (CCR) regarding an incident. Response officers will conduct a suitability review to determine appropriateness of using EVR.

A dedicated team consisting of a Sergeant and six PCs will monitor the queue and then call the victim(s) to set up a video call. If the victim is not available at that time, a diarised appointment can then be made via the scheduled element.

It's important to make clear victims will still be able to choose to see an officer in person if they wish to for the first statement, initial evidence gathering and future enquiries as the case progresses where appropriate. They will not be given an EVR appointment without first consenting.

Temporary Assistance Chief Constable Alice Scott said: "The EVR pilot is an exciting step in technological progression, providing greater channel choice to victims when reporting a crime in Suffolk. Suffolk Constabulary is committed to innovation and wanting to continuously improving how we meet the needs and expectations of our communities. This is another positive step on that journey."

The service will not cover victims under the age of 18 - these should still be dealt with face to face by an officer. The service will also not cover offences where the suspect is present or likely to return during the call, where the victim is under the influence of drugs or alcohol, where the victim has no or limited access to WiFi or 4/5G, where the victim has no or limited access to a phone or tablet with camera capabilities, any calls that would need an interpreter of any immediate 'Grade A' call.


Suffolk's Police and Crime Commissioner Tim Passmore said: "Following the introduction of rapid video response to support victims of domestic last year, I am delighted to see this evolution into enhanced video response to support victims of other crimes."

"The way we communicate with each other is changing and it is important that the Constabulary adapts too. Using technology to support victims, when it is appropriate, is good for the victims and makes the Constabulary more efficient and effective. I fully support this pilot and look forward to being updated on the results in due course."

Bird watching in Palgrave?

Are you taking part in the Big Garden Birdwatch, organised by the RSPB from Friday 24th to Sunday 26 January? Details can be obtained from www.rspb.org/birdwatch and the PDCC would be very interested to know if you see something unusual in Palgrave which we can then share in The Star.

On your visits to the Community Centre over the last five years or so, you may have noticed blue tits nesting in the cigarette bin next to the entrance doors. The Bird Group at the Natural History Museum are particularly interested to know where such nesting has taken place and we shall be reporting this to them for their records.




